### **Priorities for 2023**

#### Construction - good practices:

- tackling the challenges related to posting of workers, free movement, coordination of social security systems and dissemination of information to workers and employers
- reaching out to posted workers in the construction sector and involving them in dedicated events
- tackling labour and skills shortages, enhancing the attractiveness of a sector, provide access to the sector/occupation through training, awareness raising or information provision, and improved matching between jobseekers and employers

### Preventing social security fraud - good practices:

- tackling frauds related to the entitlement of benefits misaligned with work
- atackling the deceitful use of pension schemes and other social protection measures linked not only to posting, but also to the free movement of workers within the EU
- enhancing cooperation among different Member States' social security bodies, including cross-checking of information between social security registers of Member States
- establishing tools and measures tackling the misuse of social benefits
