Setting the vision for digital Europe



Cosmin Boiangiu, Executive Director of ELA, opened the conference with a call for collaboration and knowledge **exchange** as the foundation of Europe's digital future. He stressed that digital tools should enhance—not replace—human cooperation across borders.

Keynotes: innovation with purpose Al and labour mobility

Brando Benifei (Member of the European Parliament, Rapporteur for the Al Act) set out his vision for a Europe that leads in responsible Al.

He highlighted the Al Act's key pillars — transparency, human oversight, and continuous training — stressing that artificial intelligence must empower workers and support the free movement of labour.

Representing the Danish Presidency, Mr Baslev emphasised that shared frameworks and open standards are vital to a connected European digital infrastructure. He called for human-centred automation and investment in digital skills to ensure no worker or Member State is left behind.

Innovative Panel I & II

Moderated by **Mr Joaquim Felix**, these session showcased **six pioneering digital tools** improving compliance, efficiency, and skills recognition.

A Technological Framework for Al-Powered Cross-Interface Automated A1 Submission – (Mr Alberto Arletti, Mr Alessandro Arletti)

Automates A1 form submissions for posted workers, enhancing compliance and scalability.

PROWEB: RPA for healthcare – (Mr Bieniak, Mr Canonne)

Uses robotic process automation to streamline administrative processes in the French health insurance system, ensuring GDPR compliance.

Count'em: Where Al meets labour law – smarter compliance and payroll for the European Single Market – (Ms Zięba-Szklarska, Mr Szklarski)

A SaaS platform that automates payroll and cross-border compliance, simplifying legal workflows for HR and legal teams.

Skills Passport for Labor Mobility – (Mr Bretgeld)

An Al-powered tool creating portable skills profiles to help workers navigate diverse labour markets.

The Design of the Link4Skills Navigator: Al- Assisted Labour Market, Skills and Migration KEBS – (Ms Grabowska, Mr Wierzbicki)

Maps labour market data, skills, and migration pathways to support data-driven decision-making for policymakers and workers.

inGo: A Secure, Automated Solution for Compliance and Labour Mobility in Construction – (Mr Florian, Mr Pangratz)

Automates compliance checks in the construction sector using digitised credentials, cutting red tape and improving traceability.
